## Testing

Before leaving home, you should get a corona-test (PCR test is recommended), this test must not be older than 72 hours, when arriving in Denmark.

When arriving in Denmark you might get tested at the border or at the showground, depending on the national rules at the time. The testing is for free.

During the competition you will have to get tested every 3<sup>rd</sup> day. The test-center is 500 meters from the showground, and it will be the participants own responsibility to get there, the tests are for free. We will make samples each day to ensure, that people are getting tested. If a person fails to show a negative test, it will affect the close contacts to the person, as any of them cannot continue to compete or stay around, until the test and result is available.

# What happens if someone is tested positive with COVID 19?

If a participant is tested positive with COVID 19, that person will have to go into <u>isolation</u>. We will shortly after the quick-test arrange a PCR test for the positive tested person, to ensure that the result is correct. Close contacts will have to go into isolation as well.

If isolation is needed you can either choose to stay in your tent/lorry/caravan or you can get relocated. If you choose to stay in your own facilities, we will relocate you to a fenced area away from other riders or supporters. We will provide you with toilets and we will sort out showers for you. We will do groceries for you but on your costs. You can choose to keep your ponies stabled if other people are watching them for you, or you we can bring your ponies to your private campsite, where they can stay in a corral. We will do anything to make the isolation as good as possible.

If the positive tested person <u>has symptoms</u>, the person can get out of isolation <u>48 hours</u> after the symptoms have disappeared. If the positive tested person has <u>no symptoms</u>, the person will have to stay isolated for <u>7 days</u>.

As a **close contact** you will need to go into isolation as well and <u>get tested immediately, then on the 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> days</u> before going out of isolation. If tested positive in that period, the same procedure as for the first positive tested person will happen.

If a team loses one or more riders, they can bring in reserves. They do not need to be named up front, and there is no limit on numbers of reserves. Hopefully that makes it possible for the team to go on.

# A close contact is the following:

- A person that has been within 2 meters of the infected 15 minutes or more within the last 4 days.

# A participant is the following:

- Any person who participates in the competition as a rider, helper, trainer, supporter, parent, driver etc.

### To prevent infection with Covid 19 or being considered a close contact, we recommend the following guidelines:

- Riders should travel and sleep **separately** from other riders, this to ensure that the other riders do not have to go into isolation. (Not using the same car/lorry/tent)
- When socializing keep 2 meters distance and stay outside.
- **Do not** shake hands, kiss or hug.
- **Do not** share food or beverage.
- Wait until the last night to French kiss or more <sup>©</sup> if you really have to, and then remember to get tested when getting home.
- Use hand-sanitizer often.

#### There will be hand-sanitizer on the campsite, by the toilets and around the arena.

#### Spectators not staying on site

Spectators will not have access to same areas as participants unless they can show a Corona-pass that state they hold a negative corona test, has been vaccinated or has been infected with Corona within the last 6 months.

We are aware, that is sounds a bit borrowing or troublesome, but most of us are used to following the guidelines already, and it is a small price to pay to be able to compete, hang out and have fun again.

### What happens to my entry fee, if I get infected.

If you as an individual rider or your team get infected before the competitions begins, so you cannot compete, we will offer a <u>full refund</u>.

If it happens **after** the competition has begun, we <u>cannot offer a refund</u> anymore. But we will do our very best to make sure, that the team can continue unless it's the whole team, who is infected.
